Rules of entry to this section

- Please submit your entries as soon as possible with the appropriate fee to the Entry Secretary. Each exhibitor must use a separate entry form. Extra forms can be photocopied or downloaded from the show website. A stamped addressed envelope for your tickets would be appreciated.
- **Entries must be received before 5pm on Thursday 1st September 2022.**
- **Please do not ask us to take entries on show day, we have enough to do!**
- First Prize - £5, second prize - £3 and third prize of £1 will be awarded unless otherwise stated in the schedule. Prize money will be available between 4.30pm and 5.30pm. Any uncollected prize money will be returned to the show.
- Entry to senior classes is 50p per exhibit and junior classes are 25p per exhibit.
- Entries fees of £5 or more will allow each exhibitor to one free entrance ticket. Competitors in the Junior section who spend £2.50 or more will be receive one free junior entry ticket.
- All exhibits must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and not won a prize at Stanhope Show.
- No names to be visible on the exhibits.
- On the exhibition label provided please fill in your name in the space provided on the back. Any alteration to the front of the card will result in disqualification of the exhibit.
- The industrial section takes place in the Ridley Suite exhibition building near to the entrance of the show field.
- On the day of the show staging will take place between 8.00am and 9.45am when everyone except for show officials and judges will be asked to leave so that judging can commence. At approximately 12 noon the doors will be opened to the public.
- No exhibits are to be removed until 4.30pm. All exhibits must be removed before 5.30pm. Any items not collected will be disposed of.
- All reasonable care will be taken of exhibitor's property but the show officials accept no responsibility for any loss or damage that may occur.
- Any exhibit which does not conform to the wording of the schedule will be disqualified and shown as NAS (not according to schedule).
- All prizes are to be awarded at the judge's discretion and have the right to withhold prizes where exhibits are considered unworthy of them.
- The Judges' decision is final.
- You will be able enter the show field with your car to stage your exhibits on production of your exhibitors slip (all occupants without tickets will have to pay the entrance fee) but you **must** leave the show field as soon as possible after staging your exhibits and park in the public car park (in the Castle Park **making sure everyone receives a wristband for re-entry**). You will be able to bring your car back on to the show field after 4pm to pick up your exhibits.

- All trophies are the property of Stanhope Agricultural Society. Holders will be responsible for the safe custody of trophies in their possession and must be returned to the show organisers before next year's show
- Where trophies are awarded to the exhibitor gaining the most points in a section first prize will be awarded 5 points, second 3 points and third 1 point, in the event of a tie the exhibitor with the most firsts will be the winner.

Break eggs into a bowl, whisk lightly, add sugar, then whisk well until thick and creamy, Sieve flour, fold lightly into the mixture. Place in a well-greased 7" (18cm) cake tin. Bake in a moderate oven 180°C (350°C) or Gas mark 4 for about 30 minutes. When cool split and fill with jam and cream.
